Well, I just had to try it! And what a great experience it was. I ordered a jerk chicken sandwich. The owner came with a bowl of soup! I told him that I only ordered a sandwich but he said it was a special today and came with soup and a salad. So, I had a very large bowl of **fish** soup! It wasn't bad at all! Kind of like a chowder since it had the same ingredients - fish, potatoes, carrots, and onion - but not thick like a chowder would be.
