Regarding WHATEVER HAPPENED TO DICK TRICKLE... Actually, he won two NASCAR races: Hickory Speedway Busch series, 1997 and Darlington Busch series, 1998. Aced out a young Dale Earnhardt, Jr. for the top spot in the Darlington race.

I believe that Trickle still holds the record for the most career wins (around 1,200), mostly running the Wisconsin & Midwest short-tracks.



He is well known in the sport as one of the best chassis guys in racing and has, for years, done (and still does) the car setups for the IROC (International Race of Champions) series. By the time Dick made his way to big-time auto racing in 1989, he was 48. The top teams were looking for younger talent so he never had the opportunity to run with best equipment. Yet, he earned NASCAR rookie of the year honors in 1989 and was generally a very popular driver throughout his NASCAR career. He was that underdog that everyone likes to pull for.
