I just had to write this comment on your Chinese restaurant review from last week's paper. First of all, Hong Kong Buffet is not JUST a buffet style eating. They also provide order off the menu, which includes a huge selection of items. Just ask to see the menu. They will gladly accommodate. If you do order from that menu, then you can "doggy bag" any food you don't eat and enjoy it at home later. Price per meal, approximately the same as buffet. Also, you might want to try their lunch buffet, for \$5.25. Soft drinks, iced and hot tea are all a dollar each, with free refills.

Now for my feelings about China Palace. I too, used to love that restaurant and became a good and fast friend of the owner, Tony. Unfortunately, a reliable friend of mine passed this information on to me. It was quite upsetting. He, also loved this restaurant until he was contracted to work there for about a week. It was last summer. They arrived at 7:30 am and there was already a delivery of food that had been dropped off sitting in the sun. It was produce, seafood and meats etc. He said it sat there in the sun, which was getting hotter and hotter until approximately 11 am, when personnel arrived to take it in out of the sun and into the restaurant. Most of the work they did was in the kitchen. He commented to me, that he had never seen such a greasy, dirty kitchen before. His work has taken him into many restaurant kitchens. His crew had on cut off shorts, and when they got up off their knees, the fronts of their shins were black from the grease and dirt on the floors. My gal friend, that would go there with me, always got so stuffed up within a 1/2 hour of being there, that she could hardly breathe. There is another restaurant in town that this same thing occurs with her. When she asked her doctor about it, he commented that it was probably from grease they used for frying, that was way too old. Although I have never gotten sick from any of the food at China Palace, I just can't bring myself to go back there. Especially in the warm months. The contractor that told me all this, has never and won't go back either!!!! Just a little "FOOD" for thought.
