How did Irma affect us:

Our sons live in St Petersburg and our close friends have a winter home in Pine Key just a few miles from Key West. Our sons live in what was called Zone B so there was no mandatory evacuation. So, they found storage for their sail boat and truck but took their dinghy home with them just in case they needed it to get around., They made room in their garage for their car, put tape on all of their windows then put mattresses in front of them, submerged all of their lawn furniture in their pool, bought enough can good foods for a week and bought enough gas to power their generator for a week. Since their company produces tv and internet commercials and videos, thru-out the event they produced and shot a documentary on

what steps to take and what it was like when not evacuating prior to a cat 3 to 5 hurricane. As it turned out St Pete was not hit that hard so we had communication with them the entire time.

Our friends who have their winter home in Pine Key did not fare so well. They boarded up their home, tied their boat to a tree and left one of their cars parked in the driveway and headed back to Wisconsin early last week, hoping for the best. The tragedy is that after paying for hurricane insurance for the past 10 years, they and a couple of their neighbors decided to drop coverage this year. Still no footage of the damages from the storm surge and wind to Key West and Pine Key and they are still unable to return to see if they have a home anymore. Luckily they evacuated and didn't get caught in it like so many others did who stayed in the Keys
